A ceast and desist was posted in February. The attorney for the owners stated that they did not fall under BodyWorks regulation and they would be applying to the State for Massage permits. The State has conducted an inspection and the establishment did not pass. Ms. Vaillancourt motioned to continue with the Cease and Desist until the establishment is licensed by the State. Mr. Delfino seconded the motion and it passed 3-0.

Post Overdose Support Team

The Hudson Police, Fire, Board of Health and Justice Resource Institute will do follow ups with individuals who have overdosed. Support, resources, and drug testing are some of the services that will be offered.

Styrofoam Recycling Request

The Board approved \$1250 in FY19 to help pay the cost of styrofoam recycling. Ms. Gillis is waiting on a quote from a new vendor in Uxbridge, but is asking the Board to consider allocating \$1250 for FY20. Mr. Delfino motioned to fund \$1250 for styrofoam recycling. The motion was seconded by Ms. Vaillancourt and passed 3-0.

Old Business

Farmer's Market Update

We currently have 9 vendors. The Market will be held at the UU Church from June 18-September 24 from 3:30 PM-6:30 PM, with the exception of July 2

Recycling Sustainability Committee Update

The RSC has met 3 times. A major concern is that the Transfer Station will not remain open. Mr. Delfino motioned to have the Transfer Station remain open even if curbside pickup is available. The motion was seconded by Ms. Vaillancourt and passed 3-0.

Hazardous Waste Day Report/Next Event

It was one of the busiest with approximately 500 cars. The next Hazardous Waste Day will be Saturday, September 14.

YSAP Dodgeball Tournament Update

Very successful, 12 teams participated and approximately \$4000 was raise. Planning for next year is underway.

BP found a small area of Hazardous Waste which will cost the Town about \$10,000 to dispose of.
