5. Director's Report:

A. Review of 2021 Beach Season and Facility Opening

Mr. Santos began by reminding the Commission that all summer programs that had not yet begun would start the week of June 28th.

Mr. Santos stated that he was able to certify enough guards to meet the short term needs of the facility and would be running another course the week of June 28th to certify 6 more guards to work at the beach.

Mr. Santos stated that in all the times he had visited the beach, "at least 1x/day, if not multiple times/day", the parking had not been full and in fact has been only at 40-50% capacity to date. Mr. Santos suggested the Park Commission consider expanding access to the parking lot to non-residents later in the summer, as a means to generate additional revenue and only if the patron usage/load witnessed over the next few weeks does not increase.

Mr. Bowen stated they could discuss this in July. The other commissioners agreed.

A. Park Commission to review and comment on draft Parking Placard Program for Centennial Beach Neighborhood

Mr. Santos presented the Centennial Beach Neighborhood Parking Placard Program that he had created with assistance of two beach neighbors, to be presented to ITC at their next meeting. Mr. Chaves asked if the fine, "which is still TBD", should be posted on the street signs that will placed in this restricted parking area. Mr. Santos replied that while that may be done, if the fines change over time, the signs would have to be replaced.

Mr. Chaves suggested that rather than 5 placards be distributed to each household, give out 3 and only up to 5 if requested. Mr. Santos replied stating that the two neighbors who helped create this program informed him that those impacted by the restricted parking in this area had expressed that 5 placards would appropriate and is desired.

Mr. Bowen motion to support the Centennial Beach Neighborhood Parking Placard Program, as presented to be submitted to the ITC for consideration, modifications and approval; to then be submitted to the Select Board for final approval via ITC. Seconded by Mr. Roan and carried... Vote: 3-0, in favor
