

Hudson Conservation Commission Vacancy

The Conservation Commission is responsible for enforcing Wetlands Protection law and for managing town conservation land. The primary task of the Commission is to permit work near wetlands and waterbodies by considering impacts of storm water, vegetation changes, erosion and other disturbance on the wetland and its associated plant and wildlife communities. The Commission meets first and third Thursday evenings each month and occasionally has site visits on other evenings or weekend mornings.

Experience in a related field, such as civil engineering, hydrology, environmental law or environmental sciences, is preferred but not required. Training (paid for by the Commission) is available.
