

Metro West CD Direct Assistance Program



Applications are now being accepted!

In response to the ongoing need for financial assistance due to inflation and lingering economic effects of COVID, Metro West CD is announcing a new direct assistance program made possible by the generosity of the Foundation for MetroWest. The program is temporary in nature and funding is limited.

Applicants are eligible for:

- A one-time “cash” payment, dependent on household size
 - Individuals: \$1,000
 - 2-person household: \$2,000
 - 3+ person household: \$3,000

Residence Eligibility:

Households that live in the following communities are eligible:

- Highlighted towns are Foundation priority town
- Residents of towns in italics are also eligible for housing search case management services through another Metro West CD program

Eligible Households:

- Currently live in the Metrowest region of Boston, MA (see above list of towns)
- Total Household income (at the time of application) cannot exceed the following limits:

Household size	1 person	2 person	3 person	4 person	5 person
Income Limit 80% of area median	\$78,300	\$89,500	\$100,700	\$111,850	\$120,800

¹ Applicants who are currently homeless, but whose last permanent residence was in the Metrowest region within the past two years may be eligible provided they submit proof of their last permanent residence (i.e., last residence listed on past utility bill, bank statement, State-issued ID card, etc.) and proof of their current living arrangement in a housing shelter.
